In the name of God and in the power of the Holy Spirit, we pledge ourselves to work for peace: peace in our homes, peace in our communities, and peace in the world. **All:** Amen.

On this Battle of Britain Sunday let us praise God for those who planned, prepared and fought to the end, that our country should not be helpless before the challenge of an invader. Let us also offer ourselves anew to the service of God and of our neighbour.

All: Teach us good Lord to serve you as you deserve; to give and not to count the cost, to fight and not to heed the wounds, to toil and not to seek for rest, to labour and not to ask for any reward, save that of knowing that we do your will. Amen.
